I think it's worth reminding ourselves that Parish Council meetings usually take place in the evening because they are meetings which the public are entitled to access and also because some Parish Councillors work and are not available in the day time. I'm sure as Elveden are so keen to help the village, a representative will be happy to attend outside their normal working hours.

I have no problem with representatives from Elveden Farms attending the Parish Council meeting, but if they want to address the meeting then surely this should be an agenda item and they should provide details of what they would like to speak about. Alternatively, (and correct me if I'm wrong), they could be given a short slot in which to speak, in the same way as a member of the public gets to speak?

If they want to make a formal presentation about their plans for the village, could this be done prior to the normal meeting, again in the evening, and with notice so the public can attend if they want?

I think it should also be made clear to Elveden that the councillors who attended the meeting on 2/2/22 will now recuse themselves from any PC decisions in relation to Elveden planning applications. This would illustrate to all concerned that what is discussed and promised at a Playing Fields / Reading Room meeting with Elveden is completely separate from PC business. This would avoid any suggestion of undue influence, going forward.

On 11 February 2022 at 15:05 the SID was installed on the B1112 on the pole adjacent to number 3 The Street. The SID was positioned to monitor traffic coming into the village from the A1065. Traffic speed was measured up until the afternoon of 12 March 2022.

There are between 2700 and 3300 vehicles per weekday passing this point heading through the village towards the base.


There are between 1900 and 2600 vehicles per day over the weekend heading towards the base.

The busiest times during the week are 07:30 (380 cars p/h) and 17:30 (300 cars p/h).


The 85th Percentile Speed (most people) travel at 34.8 MPH past his point. It is important to note that the measurement point is 311m after the start of the speed restricted zone and AFTER the first bend.
