Community Notice Under S91(2) of the Localism Act 2011 Right to Bid – Acceptance of Nomination – Earlsfield Public Open Spaces

Further to my letter on 27 October 2021, I am pleased to inform you that West Suffolk Council has accepted your nomination, submitted under the Community Right to Bid, regarding the listing as an asset of community value of the land at Earlsfield – Public Open Spaces, RAF Lakenheath, IP27 9QP registered under Title no's:

- Title no. SK250587 Land only on west side of Radcliffe Road, Eriswell including Central Park Earlsfield and Pine Close
- Title no. SK191338 Land only the north side of Ash Close, RAF Lakenheath, Brandon, IP27 9QP

This land has now been added to the list of Assets of Community Value, available on the Council's website.

In the event that the owner of the property wishes to dispose of it at some point in the future (other than as a gift, inheritance, mortgage default, insolvency, death, court order or business transfer), they will inform the Council, which will trigger a moratorium period. The Council will write to you to inform you that this is the case, and what is the process for submitting an intention to bid.

The owner's intention to dispose of the property will also be recorded on the list of Assets of Community Value, on the Council's website.

Summary The Poors Charity

The parish council inherited responsibility for the charity in 1894 from the overseers of The Poors.

The Parish Council appointed 3 Trustees and laid down the criteria for the annual `dole`, which was given out by the Trustees, with some additional payments in the case of need.

The trustees accepted a valuation for land sold in 1962 to the Great Ouse River Board., conveyance signed in 14/10/1962 the income was used to buy war stock (3.5%)

The stock appeared in the council's accounts to 1975.

Land exchanged with Lord Iveagh in 1965.

The PC registered the remaining property as Common Land in 1968.

In December 2006 the Charity Commission advised that EPC were the current Trustee for the property which contravened the 1972 Government Act does not allow a local authority to hold gifts for the benefit of the poor. To consider the voluntary registration of land (2 roods36 perches of land at Homecroft)

On 23rd November 2010, a meeting between EPC and the Eriswell Poors Estate Charity was held to consider the voluntary registration of land (2 roods36 perches) of land at Homecroft. The registration was completed 14th March 2011 valued at one thousand pounds. A rood = a quarter of an acre, a perch = 25.29 square metres, there are 40 perches in a rood. 2 roods and 36 perches are almost three quarters of an acre.

23rd November 1984 The charity was registered- number 227940, Poors Estate, Object - General Benefit of the Poor. Consent for a wayleave from Eastern Electricity for a line to cross the land was refused on 17th July 1989.

Poors Estate originally consisted of 2 double cottages with small gardens used as poorhouse, an allotment of 14 acres and 1 rood 2 perches of land in Rowley croft. Rents were distributed to the poor according to the size of their families.

Current situation

Circa 1,200 pounds sterling in bank

Three quarters of an acre currently dormant land

The Governing Document was not included in the file handed to the current clerk

Introduction

The purpose of this document is to identify risks to the community within the village of Eriswell that would likely require support from the Parish Council, either immediately or subsequently. It outlines the roles and responsibilities required to neutralise the incident to support a return to normality.

This plan does not seek to encompass those activities and responsibilities undertaken by statutory agencies, such as Fire, Police, Medical Local Authorities etc. It does however indicate how EPC can facilitate and assist such agencies with local support, premises and knowledge where required. The effectiveness of local liaison and assistance should not be underestimated.

EPC undertakes, within its powers, responsibilities and ability, to assist with the support of the vulnerable during a crisis scenario.

Claire Johnson has forwarded your email to me as the surveyor that previously dealt with the above property and the recorded dangerous structure case.

The situation was reported 19th October 2021 and I carried out an inspection of the outbuilding and discussed the matter with the owner. He is aware that the building was hit and partly demolished, and has been cleaning up any debris that has fallen into the road. We have been monitoring the situation and although unsightly there appears to be no further risk of further collapse in the near future; therefore no further action is required to be taken against the owner at this time.
