# 2023/60 **UPDATES FROM COUNTY/DISTRICT COUNCILLORS** a. <u>Update from Sqn Leader S Geary</u> July 2023: In addition to the routine competency and currency training sorties being conducted at RAF Lakenheath, July saw some 48FW aircraft continue their deployment in support of air policing on NATO's Eastern flank. Other aircraft participated in an Exercise in Italy, whilst others participated in air shows, including the Royal International Air Tattoo at RAF Fairford. The Station hosted a visit by a team from UK Search and Rescue on 12 Jul 23. The Civil Engineering Squadron conducted an exercise with members of the Royal Engineers at RAF Feltwell on 18 and 19 Jul 23, and the Wing welcomed veterans for a F-111 reunion over the weekend of 27-29 Jul 23. Meanwhile, instructors from the Airmen Leadership Squadron completed some joint training initiatives with members of the RAF's Aviator Command Squadron at RAF Halton on 5 and 6 Jul 23. Finally, Changes of Command continued throughout the month of Jul. Notably, the new Maintenance Group Commander, Col Sam Mink, assumed command on 7 Jul 23. August 23: As well as continuing their deployment on NATOs Eastern Flank and conducting the routine competency and currency training sorties from the home base, 48FW aircraft deployed on a short-notice ACE Exercise in Europe and supported an Airshow in Greece this month. Additionally, at the back end of the month 48FW hosted F35 aircraft from Norway. Early in the month, members of the 48FW Munitions Team collaborated with personnel from the RAF Marham Armourers Team on an Armaments Capability Exercise at both RAF Lakenheath and RAF Fairford. The Logistics and Security Forces Teams hosted some HMVV training at RAF Feltwell for members of the Queens Dragoons Guards, based at Swanton Morley in Norfolk. RAF Commander and 48FW/CC attended the UK ACE Symposium at JSCSC Shrivenham on 24 Aug 23. 48FW conducted a Public Health Exercise on 16 Aug 23. 48FW hosted over 100 cadets for Station visits to RAF Lakenheath during a 2-week period this month. Following the tragic death of an airman in a RTC in late July, 48FW conducted a repatriation service from RAF Mildenhall and subsequently held a remembrance service at RAF Lakenheath early in the month of August. RAF Commander engaged with West Suffolk Council and Suffolk Highways in an effort to address vegetation/foliage covering road signs in the local area. Engagement identified a webpage that can be used to report any highways issues in the local area. 48FW Safety Team now using this tool to highlight any local off-Station road safety issues identified by USVF personnel. Vikki Quamina has joined the Station as the new Community Relations Advisor. Any events etc. should be sent to the CRA mailbox. She hopes to attend a parish council meeting in the next few months. Remembrance events are being pulling together Night flying last week and this week (necessary training exercises) Looking forward, plans are in place for the USVF to support Battle of Britain community. The Clerk had contacted Sqn Ldr Geary about the ownership of Radcliff Road streetlights – he had searched available emails and cannot find references. The

# Lords Walk Road Signage Deterioration

The Eriswell Parish council requested at the meeting of 25/07/2023 that a report be submitted detailing the current state of road signs for guiding motorists to Lords Walk.

There were/are a total of 6 yellow road signs, attached to existing street furniture on the A1065 and B1112, used to guide road users on how to travel to the village of Lords Walk.

One sign is still in good condition.

Two signs have been removed or have been knocked off during pavement mowing.

Three signs are still attached but in very poor condition and no longer legible.

## Appendix D Traffic Report

On 01 July 2023 at 10:00 the SID was installed on the B1112 on the pole in Little Eriswell. The SID was positioned to monitor traffic coming into the roundabout in the village of Lords Walk from Lakenheath. Traffic speed was measured up until 16:00PM of 31 August 2023.

The battery of the SID lost power between 15 August and 19 August and the battery was replaced.

There are between 4200 and 4800 vehicles per weekday passing this point from Lakenheath.

There are between 2700 and 3400 vehicles per day over the weekend from Lakenheath.

The busiest time during the week is 06:30-07:30 (peak 500 cars p/h). Unlike other areas measured in the parish, there is only one daily peak.


The 85<sup>th</sup> Percentile Speed (most people) travel at or below **36.4 MPH** past his point.

The 50<sup>th</sup> Percentile Speed (half the traffic) travel at or below **29.6 MPH** past his point.


The fastest speed recorded was 65MPH (x19).


01/07/2023 to 31/08/2023 in Little Eriswell – Traffic From Lakenheath
