Stew Geary:</u> not present</p> <p>The clerk told the meeting that Sqn Ldr Geary had confirmed to the Lakenheath parish council meeting that he was leaving his post (April 2024)</p> <p>It was RESOLVED that the clerk would compile a list of outstanding actions ready for the next incumbent.</p> <p>Cllr Bibbey had written to the Low Flying Complaints Unit; the response was to ask him to log incidents</p>	Clerk
b.	<p><u>Update from C/Cllr Colin Noble:</u> not present</p> <p>The clerk had received an email from Cllr Noble 22.01.2024:</p> <p><i>a. The street lights need to be reported do they have SCC numbers strapped to them? If not, I will try to find out if the road is adopted or still private. If private they will belong to the property company.</i></p> <p><i>b. With regards the signage again this needs to be reported and if you can then let me have the report number, I can seek Highways views. I do know its tricky when the signs are on private property.</i></p> <p><i>With kind regards, / Colin Noble</i></p> <p>a. The clerk confirmed that the numbers and photographs of the Radcliffe Road lights had already been sent to SCC Lighting, she will resend</p> <p>b. Clerk to take this forward</p> <p>Cllr Bibbey told the meeting that planning consent is required for such large advertising signs</p>	<p>Clerk</p> <p>Clerk</p>
c.	<p>Update from West Suffolk D/Cllr G Kelly</p> <p>D/Cllr Kelly reported that there is a lot going on. In terms of the Local Plan, clearly there are a considerable number of things that need to be resolved. Brandon are still down to have 10 houses allocated, whereas Lakenheath have 800 allocated. This limitation has been imposed because of the arbitrary definition of the area containing Stone Curlews.</p> <p>The District Council are bringing in the Brandon Commission i.e. bringing in a KC to look at the issues, particularly around the Stone Curlew.</p> <p>Natural England insist that there is no way of mitigating the situation, which makes no sense as the birds curlews live within a few metres of the REA.</p> <p>The District Council have been trying to get to a better standard of house insulation, the scheme has not been taken up very well.</p> <p>The insulation can be purchased at Travis Perkins, at a discounted rate, WSC will give back up to £200.</p> <p>Cllr Kelly has not been involved in the infra-red camera scheme.</p> <p>The District Council are looking at trebling solar panel generation.</p> <p>Remember that this is a completely new administration.</p> <p>Glyphosate: in 2015 there was an advisory that this was carcinogenic and lots of councils banned it. Brighton Town Council have now said this is crazy- whilst it is obviously a hazardous chemical, many subsequent reports do not agree that it is carcinogenic. All the problems around paths, drains etc. show that there is no other solution to the weeds. The WSC maintenance teams carry out work for SCC: watch this space. Please let Cllr Kelly know if you have strong views on this.</p> <p>Comment: crawling around in lofts is not for everyone, I got it cheaper from installers</p>	

	<p>GK: We are open to suggestions</p> <p>Q: Houses on Station Road?</p> <p>GK: They are pretty much all affordable homes and the school. The contractor has a problem and will have to look at groundwork again.</p> <p>Planning is not about shoving up as many houses as you can in order to tick a box. Must look at sustainability e.g. how many more cars will it put on road clearly depends on size of what is being built</p> <p>Comment: what Eriswell will get is lots more cars</p> <p>Q: Any development on land near shops?</p> <p>GK: Any housing would have to maintain the open spaces and we would expect the developer to contribute to a facility for the whole of Lords Walk</p> <p>Q: I sent a plan of footpaths has this been noted?</p> <p>GK: Not as far as I know</p> <p>Q: Lords Walk has 5 squadrons of pigeons nesting under solar panels. Do the panels need planning?</p> <p>GK: Not if being installed by a contractor</p> <p>GK: In terms of council tax, local band D is £1963.27 whilst Bury St Edmunds is £1900.93. US personnel increase precept proportionally. In Burnham Market and other North coast villages, the issue is a lot of holiday lets. The landlord contributes nothing because of the way it works. Burnham Market have written to the landlords asking for £100 contribution.</p> <p>It is thought around 5,400 service people live here - the numbers are big. The US Government hands over money, but it seems the UK Treasury have decided we can't have it. Trying to find ways of pushing and resolving this.</p>

P Maxwell, Suffolk Constabulary</p> <p>(addition to original agenda)</p> <p>Sgt Maxwell explained that there has been a recent change in policing methods and community policing is now taking place, integrating into schools, working with Housing Associations.</p> <p>Sgt Maxwell loves living in Lords Walk.</p> <p>Just changed everything in Community Policing. 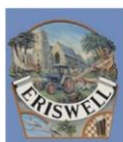

Traffic Report

December 2023

On 31 August 2023 at 15:00 the SID was installed on the B1112 on the pole positioned at the start of the village of Eriswell. The SID was positioned to monitor traffic coming from the A1065 on the B1112 heading towards the St. Laurence church in Eriswell. Traffic speed was measured up until 11:00 of 03 January 2024.

There are between 2800 and 3000 vehicles per weekday passing this point heading towards Eriswell.

There are between 1900 and 2500 vehicles per day over the weekend heading towards Eriswell.

The busiest times during the week are 07:00-08:30 (Avg. 310 cars p/h) and 17:30-18:30 (Avg. 280 cars p/h).

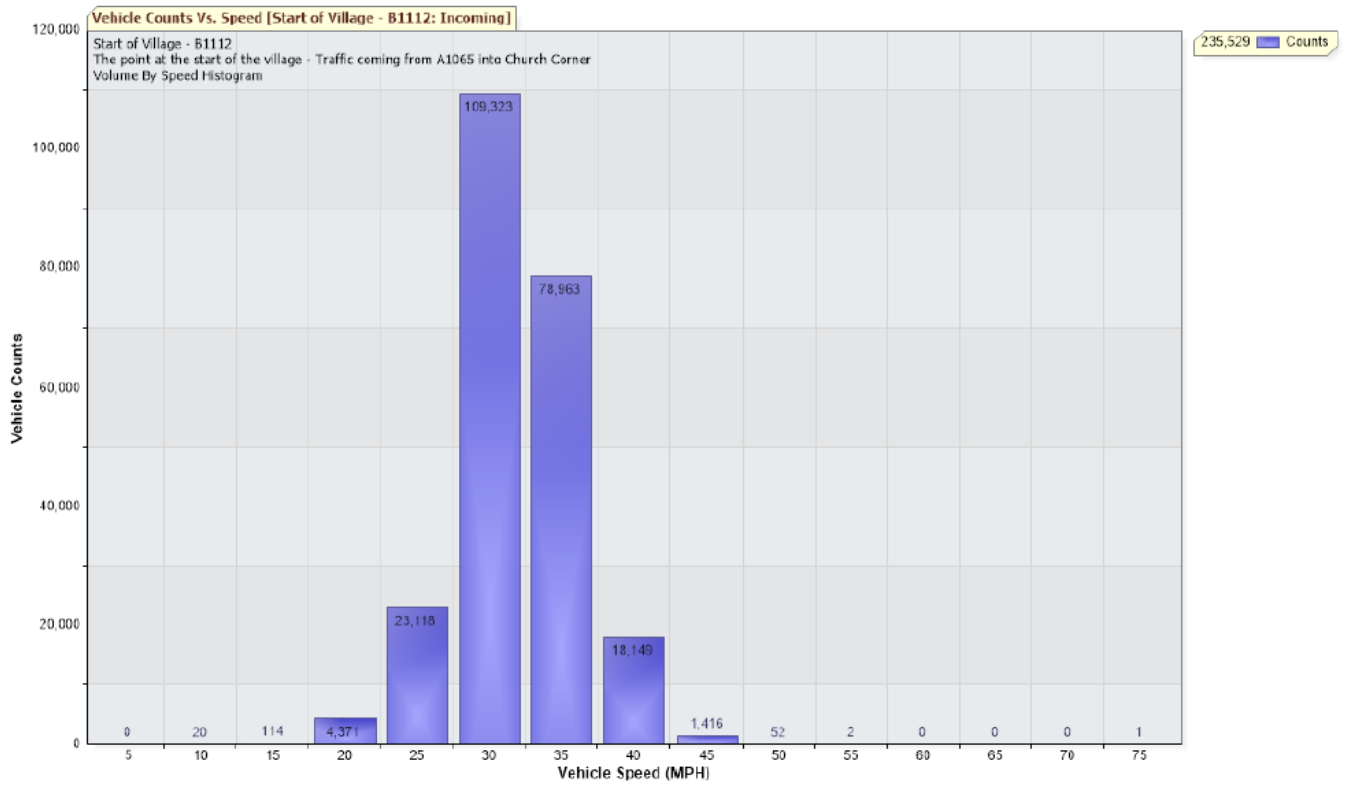
The 85th Percentile Speed (most people) travel at or below **34.0 MPH** past his point.

The 50th Percentile Speed (half the traffic) travel at or below **29.1 MPH** past his point.

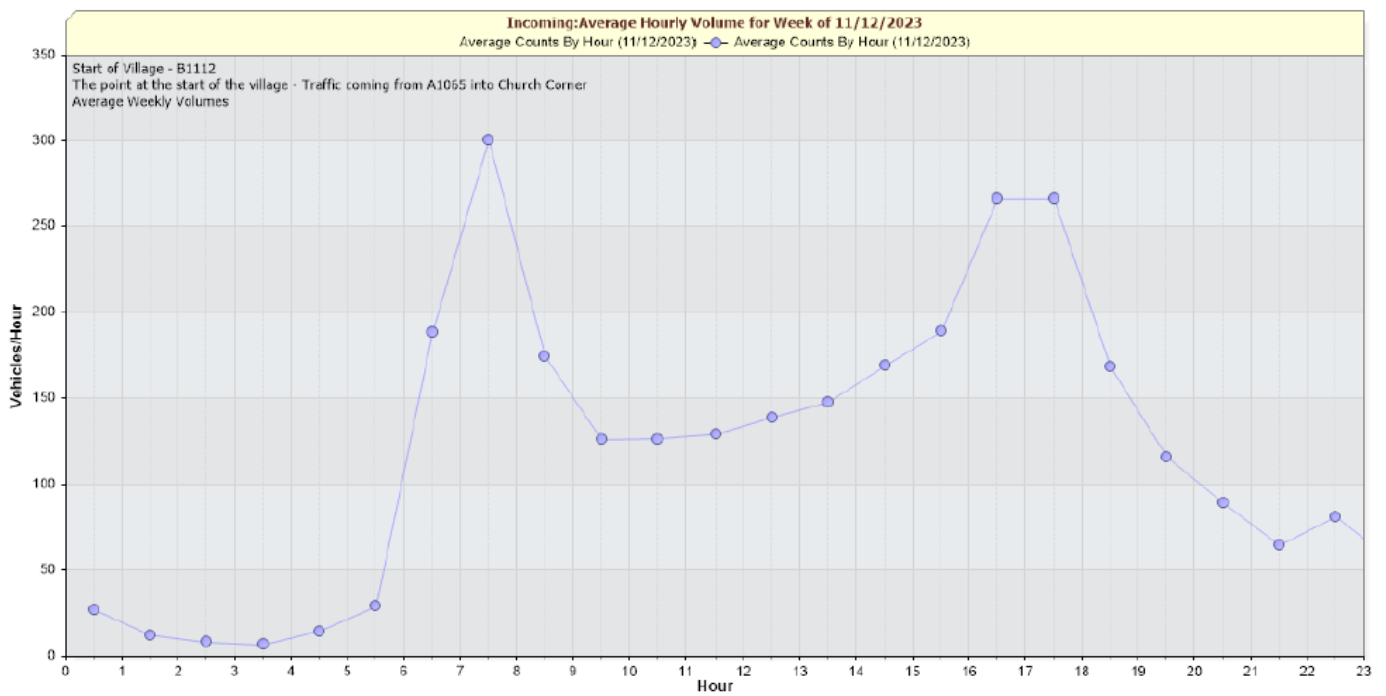
